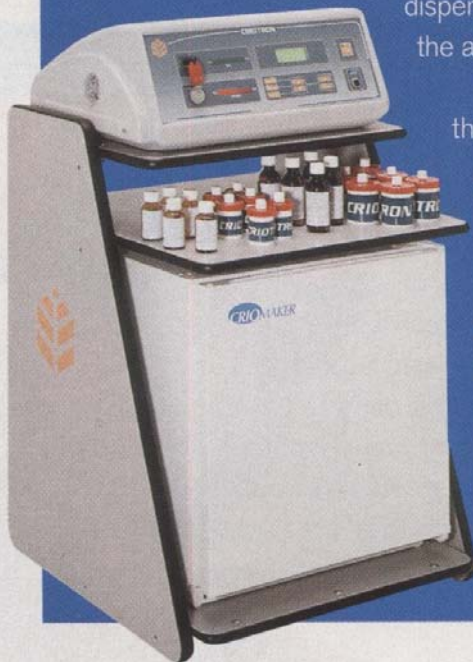

## CRYOGENIC TECHNOLOGY INTRODUCED

This February, at the 2005 Spa & Resort Expo & Conference in Los Angeles, Intégrée introduced the first cryogenic technology for use in the U.S. medical spa industry. Intégrée's Criosystem uses cryoelectrophoresis, in which a mild electrical current passes active ingredients through the first layer of skin. Developed in 1979, cryoelectrophoresis sends a higher concentration of

ingredients below the skin's first layer by freezing the blood vessels, which prevents unnecessary dispersion and enables the ingredients to remain in the affected area for an extended period of time.

The freezing technology is only part of the three-phase Intégrée system, which focuses on analysis, rebalancing, and treatment. To start, the clients' body and skin type are analyzed. Next, a program of at-home treatments, body wraps, essential-oil baths, herbal supplements, and massages rebalances the body. Finally, using an Intégrée technology, such as the Criosystem, endocosmetics treat blemishes from the inside out. Medical spas receive complimentary training for as long as they offer the system.
